6. The upcoming election will result in government leaders being prayerfully chosen to lead with integrity and honesty.
7. The partnerships between the churches in the Pittsburgh Presbytery and the churches in the Synod of Blantyre (CCAP) in Malawi, Africa will continue to be partnerships of mutual encouragement in our faith and life journeys (Romans 1:12).

What is Prayer?

Prayer is simply a two-way conversation with God, our Creator. We talk to God and God listens. God talks to us and we listen.

Silence

"Be **still**, and **know** that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." -Psalm 46:10

- ♦ Prayers can be spoken, sung, silent and even sighs too deep for words.
- ♦ Prayer can be private or with small groups or with large groups in your church or community.
- ♦ Remember, prayer is developing a relationship with our God who loves you. (John 3:16)

Adoration

Confession

"In Christ we have redemption through his blood, the **forgiveness** of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace" -Ephesians 1:7

Thanksgiving

"Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be **thankful**." -Colossians 3:15

Supplication

"Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will **receive**, and your joy will be complete." -John 16:24

Discover the Power of Prayer Walking

Prayer walking involves people who are simply walking and talking quietly to God. They do not need to be obvious or the center of attention. Gather in groups of 2-3 for this powerful time of prayer.



As people are walking in the church, and around the church and community, they are simply silently praying for people in the church, neighborhood, community, nation and world.

It is not only about praying for everything going on, it is about praising and thanking God for the positive things also. While prayer walking our eyes, ears, feet, mouth and all our senses are open to God. What we need to pray for is right in front of us.

5 Amazing Ways for Starting or Revitalizing a Prayer Group

A prayer group gives members something outside of and bigger than themselves for which to pray. Incorporating these key elements in your prayer group will create a tremendous sense of joy and unity.

1. Encourage all members to know why they are meeting -- to pray for renewal in themselves, their church, community, nation and world.
This gives members purpose.
2. Read or recite scripture during prayer.
This gives guidance and focus.
3. Write down what the Lord is up to between prayer group meetings.
This gives excitement and anticipation.
4. Listen to God, thanking and praising God for responding and working in the lives of members.
This deepens the relationship with God.
5. Establish a ritual of starting and ending on time. Spend most of the time in prayer.
This creates discipline.
